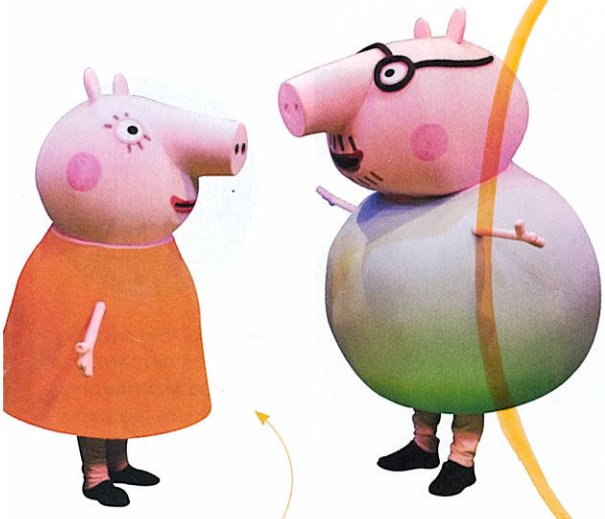


Raiders of the Lost Ark

CLIFFORD THE BIG RED DOG LIVE!

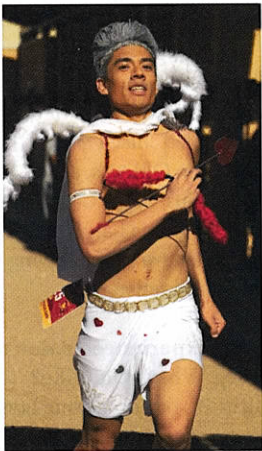
