



ARTS San Antonio's mission is to Entertain, Enrich and Education the people, especially the children, of San Antonio and South Texas. In addition to ARTS San Antonio's customary public performances, between August 1, 2017 and July 31, 2018, ARTS San Antonio's ARTSTEACH program impacted San Antonio area students and seniors:

## **ARTSTEACH Aggregate Impact, August 1, 2017 to July 31, 2018**

- **631 programs** for schools, community centers, senior-living centers and nonprofit organizations.
- **11,099 students** participated.
- Includes **282 Title I schools** or agencies in **economically disadvantaged neighborhoods**.
- Includes **4,649 students** attending **Title I schools** or from agencies in **economically disadvantaged neighborhoods**.

## **ARTSTEACH Workshops**

- **444 workshops** given in Elementary and Middle School classrooms, community centers and senior-living centers.
- **5,208 students** participated in hands-on workshops.
- Includes **227 workshops** were given on **Title I** campuses or agencies in economically disadvantaged neighborhoods.
- Includes **2,955 individuals** participating on **Title I school campuses** or in **economically disadvantaged neighborhoods**.

## **ARTSTEACH Masterclasses and Clinics**

- **10 masterclasses and clinics** by globally significant performing artists given on middle school, high school and university campuses and at a community center serving mixed-age families.
- **340 students** participated.

## **ARTSTEACH Hosted Attendance**

- **140 schools, community centers and nonprofit organizations** participated.
- **2,284 students** attended.
- Includes **38 Title I schools** or agencies in **economically disadvantaged neighborhoods**.
- Includes **655 students** attending **Title I schools** or from agencies in **economically disadvantaged neighborhoods**.

## **ARTSTEACH Performances for Student Audiences**

- **37 elementary, middle and high school campuses** participated.
- **3,267 students** attended.
- Includes **17 Title I schools** or agencies in **economically disadvantaged neighborhoods**.
- Includes **1,039 students** attending **Title I schools**.
